





People and Events that have influenced my Motorcycle Life, Tom Goetz

We all have had these experiences in our lives, so I thought I would share a few with you as a response to me winning the 50/50 draw in March.

I would have to start with my father. In some families riding a bike was not encouraged, even called dangerous. My family was quite different. You see during World War 2 my father, some of the time, was in the Military Police Motorcycle Division guarding high-ranking officers in England. My sisters and I were encouraged rather than discouraged about riding. He enjoyed this duty as it took him all over England and Scotland. There was quite the "bond" between these men and their lives were always at risk. Such was the day they were attacked by a lone German fighter plane on its way back to Germany. Sprayed by machine guns and a few rockets, he and another biker were seriously wounded, their bikes destroyed, the officer was okay as the driver was able to make cover. The officer was very helpful to my dad during his recovery and even went so far as when my dad was able, the officer got him "parts" of BSA motorcycles so that he could put one together to ride. This became the major part of my dad's recovery therapy during this time of the War. My dad was in hospital for several months and yes he did re-build a BSA for use later on. Several years later, when on a break from University, several friends and I on bikes showed up at my Mom and Dad's place in Kelowna. At the astonishment of my friends, my father jumped on my BMW and went for a ride with them. He always taught me "safety, fun and maintenance" of your bike. If you could have seen the look on his face when he went for a ride and the look on my friends faces, you know how much he loved to ride bikes. For that I thanked him all his life.

Another influencing person is my sister Paddy. Now in her 7 o's, she also had her share of motorcycles. One was a Triumph Tiger 500. She and her new husband spent their honeymoon riding through England and a great deal of Europe, experiencing all kinds of adventures. I can remember her talking about what it was like seeing parts of the world on her bike and how people were so surprised to see a young woman in her 20's and her partner riding into their city and looking for the next adventure. They had that bike shipped back to Canada and eventually sold it to one of my University friends who happily rode it for years. I have memories of her riding behind me on my BMW through parts of the Okanagon. It seems that amongst my immediate family that when we ride bikes, we get this smile on our faces. Something that all of you understand.

I lived in Prince George for 40 years. During "Spring Break", I would some times visit my Sister and Husband in Victoria. I got to ride their Honda 900 Super Sport. Since I still had feet of snow in Prince George, to go for a ride in Victoria was quite the treat. Good memories as later my wife and I would rent a Honda 750 Shadow and ride up and down Vancouver Island. To this day, when I first rode up to where Paddy lives now in Prince Edward Island, she says the best bike that has been in our family has been the Gold Wings that I have owned. I would have to agree.

One last person I would like to mention is my friend Mike. We have known each other since we were 5 years old. He owned a Honda 55 Super Cub (I am not sure of the right name for this bike) and he was having so much fun on this bike that he shared it with me. As things would happen he wanted a bigger bike, so I bought this one from him. The next one he bought was a special order Honda 305 Super Hawk. It was one of seven that the Vancouver Police force had brought in to try for use in City traffic. It was a lot of fun to ride and yes, I ended up buying this bike from him. With this bike I started my "touring" days and have never looked back. Life took us down different paths and away from bikes. I was able to come back. He got into Boats and more Boats. Yet to this day when we get together we still smile about the years on bikes.

As you have now noticed, there is a theme through this writing. Bikes can bring great memories for family and friends. I am sure you all have such stories, and they are yours to share and remember. Enjoy.
