## January 2016 Region Report

Thanks to the Bravest Folks on 2-3 Wheels!

Most of us are fortunate to have someone special to enjoy our 2, 3, or 4 wheel travels with around the country. These dedicated and wonderful people, known as Co-Riders, are certainly some of the bravest people we know. They continually occupy that seat behind us as we cruise down the highway at 65 mph or more with no controls at all.

That is particularly scary when National statistics indicate that almost 90% of those people in the front seat have had no formalized training. I realize that because of our Rider Education and Training in GWRRA, that our riders do a lot better than the National Average. We even offer great training for our Co-Riders as well, another benefit of Membership in GWRRA.

National Co-Rider Appreciation Day is on February 14 this year. (Non-motorcyclists still call if Valentine's Day). Throughout the year, but especially on that day, we salute these wonderful partners in our travels and adventures going down the "Highway of Happiness" called life.

As Riders, what can we do to repay these great Co-Riders?

First, we can try and make that back seat as comfortable as possible. Let's start with good shock absorbers, arm rests, foot rests, good sound and CB system for the Co-Rider, and an electric outlet for electric warming gear. Don't forget that our riding style affects our passenger too. Try to make our shifting, stopping and turning as smooth as possible.

Second, we need to remember that our Co-Rider, even though they are only inches away, receive a different measure of wind, temperature, rain and noise. Because of these important factors, as riders we need to stay aware of our Co-Riders changing needs with respect to adding or subtracting layers of clothing and putting on rain gear, etc. Windshield height and air-wing adjustments might help also.


Third, you can win the very top award in the Co-Rider Book by just asking these two questions, loud "Should I stop and ask for directions?" "Do you need to go to the bathroom?"

Please consider these 3 minor considerations for our Co-Riders as a token repayment for all that they do for us as Co-Riders. Besides being our favorite companions, they contribute a great deal to our safety as we travel. They bring an extra set of eyes and ears that can save our lives. Did you know that we can even increase our peripheral vision substantially when we have our Co-Rider on board?

So, let's make every day "Co-Rider Appreciation Day." The rewards are numerous and important to all of us.




## 50/50 Article




Chapter A's Annual New Years Day Breakfast


## Chapter A Members Enjoy some 4 wheel fun on Go Carts




