I'd love to tell you in detail about the rides and rallies over the last month but Tracy and I have been crazy busy with family and we had to cancel out on a few of the good ones.



Oh that wonderful feeling that makes you want to pull over to the side of the road, take your helmet off and scratch your scull until it bleeds. I have never experienced such torture until I did a ride with many long days of riding in hot weather. I just figured that I must need to wet my head down on a regular basis and keep cool and although that helped, the monster just kept coming back. With some quick reading I found a few sites that recommended that you just clean your helmet as often as possible and that would solve the problem. Well cleaning alone didn't solve the problem and I have

learned a few things since then like there are lots of conditions that can cause the issue that are irritated by a hot and sweaty helmets. All I can tell you is I started with the basics and that worked for me.

- 1. Keep the helmet clean by washing it with shampoo not laundry soap. Shampoo is designed for your scalp and laundry soap can irritate it especially if the helmet is not perfectly dry when you put it on. Allow it to air dry not blow dry.
- 2. Ensure your helmet is well ventilated and that the vents are open while wearing it.
- 3. Helmet itch can be a fungus and can be easily treated using shampoos that contain ketoconazole like Nizoral or in combination cleaning your helmet and occasionally giving the helmet liner a spray with an antifungal spray commonly used for athlete's foot. Shampoos with ketoconazole can also help treat dandruff and seborrhea.
- 4. Using cleaning sprays rather than washing the liner may not remove oils from the liner and ultimately be ineffective.
- Use a "do-rag" or some other cover to protect your head from your helmet liner and static electricity.
- 6. Be diligent with preventative measures because you can pass it back and forth between you and your helmet.
- 7. If it persists, get it checked out.

This helped me guite a bit and maybe it will help you as well.






my Cousin Raine visiting me from Ontario. It was her first time in British Columbia and







GWRRA BC Drill Team Riding July 2016

From one of the Drill Team Trainees, Ian McAlpine

I was asked years ago by Dave Truesdell to come out and participate with the Drill Team, but because of my job (Air Conditioning Service Technician) and being on 24 HR call once every 4 to 6 weeks, and not knowing whether I could even make it out to practice due to the location of the jobs, our work area is from Chilliwack to UBC, and changes day to day, so it is very difficult to get home with the service truck, change and get back to the practice with the Motorcycle. I didn't feel it was right or it was fair to work with the team taking up a spot, and only practicing with them maybe a 1/4 of the time and then maybe making it out to shows or events and one of the members having to ride beside someone different from me at practice, or beside me and hoping I knew the routine well enough that I would not make any big mistakes to cause a major accidents.

As the years went by and I got older and the work seamed to slow down somewhat I was again approached by a member of the Drill Team this time to use my bike for the Reno Show. Three reasons I was asked, I think

- 1) because I loaned my bike previously to Kelly Parks for him to use at Region "J" Rally Langley when his bike was out of commission.
- 2) because my bike had a trailer hitch and could carry the flags.
- 3) I was planning to go to Reno anyway.

I again was asked later if I would help them out and ride my bike and carry the flags at the show in Reno, which meant going to as many practices (4) I think as possible to learn the right spot to be in at the right time previous to getting to Reno. Sounded easy enough, till Rob Ellis decided to use me for more than just sitting in the middle and being circled by the other members. He wanted to add me in to the beginning and the end of the show which now I really had to be listening to the caller (Rob) and practice the tight turns that the Drill Team make look so simple, and do it in front of a very large crowd in Reno.



I again informed them I didn't think it was not fair to them (the drill team) if I couldn't make the practices and might end up making them look bad. Rob informed me that the Team had all the confidence in me to get the job done and that I would be helping them all out if I were to do this for them.

With the help of all the Drill Team members I was able to work on my head turns, both directions, leaning the bike both directions, slower turns, and keeping my head and eyes up everything I was teaching others to do at an ARC course but still not doing it myself as well as the Drill Team Members, & riding in close proximity to others and knowing that if and when I made a mistake that all the other riders on the team were so good they could make adjustments so fast and without any hesitation that my big mistakes looked like little bloopers. "MOST OF THE TIME"

Well got to Reno it was very hot, very windy, the show parking surface we were riding on was a painted parking lot and the crowd was beginning to get larger and before I knew it had done the show and we were finished. I had made it through my first show with the team, and received congratulations and thank you from all the members. it was very satisfying and It was a Blur, afterwards. Had I done okay, did I make any mistakes time will tell.

The crowd seamed to enjoy it and when I got to the tables for the send off dinner everyone from BC & other GWRRA members had nothing but good things to say about the Drill Team show.


