
Coming up the next breakfast meeting there will be a transfer of Officers as we welcome our new Directors and Treasurer so please put that one on your calendar, come out and give your support.

#### **EMP (Electro Magnetic Pulse) Effects on Vehicles**

Most of you have heard (some of you way to many times) the story of what happened to me on my trip in June while riding through North Dakota. For that reason I won't tell the entire story I will just say that after riding in close proximity to clouds during a sheet lighting strike I experienced some very, very weird stuff. I have been researching it ever since to try and figure out what actually happened. This is as close as I can get as all the bikes lights went out and as far as I can remember the

bike did not stall. All the controls locked up for a period of time and my cell went into emergency mode. The test below discusses testing and the results but not from lighting so I am making some assumptions.

#### Test

The potential EMP vulnerability of automobiles derives from the use of built-in electronics that support multiple automotive functions. Electronic components were first introduced into automobiles in the late 1960s. As time passed and electronics technologies evolved, electronic applications in automobiles proliferated. Modern automobiles have as many as 100 microprocessors that control virtually all functions. While electronic applications have proliferated within automobiles, so too have application standards and electromagnetic interference and electromagnetic compatibility (EMI/EMC) practices. Thus, while it might be expected that increased EMP vulnerability would accompany the proliferated electronics applications, this trend, at least in part, is mitigated by the increased application of EMI/EMC practices.

We tested a sample of 37 cars in an EMP simulation laboratory, with automobile vintages ranging from 1986 through 2002. Automobiles of these vintages include extensive electronics and represent a significant fraction of automobiles on the road today. The testing was conducted by exposing running and non-running automobiles to sequentially increasing EMP field intensities. If anomalous response (either temporary or permanent) was observed, the testing of that particular automobile was stopped. If no anomalous response was observed, the testing was continued up to the field intensity limits of the simulation capability (approximately 50 kV/m).

Automobiles were subjected to EMP environments under both engine turned off and engine turned on conditions. No effects were subsequently observed in those automobiles that were not turned on during EMP exposure. The most serious effect observed on running automobiles was that the motors in three cars stopped at field strengths of approximately 30 kV/m or above. In an actual EMP exposure, these vehicles would glide to a stop and require the driver to restart them. Electronics in the dashboard of one automobile were damaged and required repair. Other effects were relatively minor. Twenty-five automobiles exhibited malfunctions that could be considered only a nuisance (e.g., blinking dashboard lights) and did not require driver intervention to correct. Eight of the

37 cars tested did not exhibit any anomalous response.

Based on these test results, we expect few automobile effects at EMP field levels below 25 kV/m. Approximately 10 percent or more of the automobiles exposed to higher field levels may experience serious EMP effects, including engine stall, that require driver intervention to correct. We further expect that at least two out of three automobiles on the road will manifest some nuisance response at these higher field levels. The serious malfunctions could trigger car crashes on U.S. highways; the nuisance malfunctions could exacerbate this condition. If you wish to hear the whole story I would be glad to share.

Our team "Moto Safety Expert" Carl Scouten has some insight on how our team accomplishes this activity by helping local "Pro Race" and "Armature Bicycle Races" run "Safer races" with the help of "Agile" moto's to head the race, and tail the race, in many different formats. This particular side of the BCMDT started with John Waddington putting boots to the ground, and "Nose" to the grind stone, starting this part of our team fundraising and this has gone a long ways to help us facilitate our team activities. It has been a very good idea, but one that does have some work attached to it!

### YOU PROBABLY HAVE SEEN OUR AD IN THE NEWS LETTERS AND WONDERED WHATIS THAT ALL ABOUT......

- -What we do is try to be the eyes and ears for the race committee,
- -We will lead and tail each group as they start a race, usually 3 groups take off 2 minutes apart
- -The fastest group will start first followed by the slower groups,
- -The tail Moto of each group will pass the individual cyclists as they fall off of the pace,
- -When a group splits and 2 or 3 maybe 4-5 go ahead of their group, the lead moto will stay in front of the split group, the tail will stay behind the leftover group, but still passing the slower cyclists as they leave the main group
- -If you are lead of second or third group same rules apply.....

Except when the second group either splits and are overtaking the group ahead, the lead Moto will inform the tail of group ahead that they are coming through,

-The Lead of that group then will go ahead and the cyclists will then pass through that group. Leaving his remainder split group with the tail rider, We are always in contact with each other during the race, Hence the need for CB radio,

Yes we always have a lot of fun doing these races,

we will meet for breakfast or coffee somewhere, before race time.

Then when we escort Gran Fondo it's just that, just escorting cyclists to a spot.

Call me to discuss but this will give you a idea of what we do .

### GWRRA BC Drill Team Riding August 2017

With a view to adding something to your chapter newsletters, we are continuing this year with Drill Team Tech articles. While we share these opinions and viewpoints, these articles are not intended to provide you instruction on how to ride your motorcycle. Please seek assistance from a professional riding school, or GWRRA rider course to improve your riding skills.

#### New team riders and Past team riders! How do they fit in?

Riders come, and riders go all for different reasons. Life sometimes dictates to us when we have availability to do this stuff, and then as fast as it allows us that precious time, life will sometimes take that time away from us. Most teams have a similar issue with riders making it onto the team only to lose them again at some point in the future and we have to start again finding new riders and bringing their riding skills up to sufficient standard to be comfortable riding the way drill teams do. There can NEVER be too many drill team bikes.

#### How do New Riders Fit into the Team?

Well new team riders are kind of like "open books" because they mostly won't have any pre-conceived notions of how the team operates, or how they interact. Who's the team lead? Who backs the lead up? Who's the glue that is able to connect to everyone and keeps the humor alive, and atmosphere light? New riders get to find all of that stuff out in time and things fall into place.

Like any other team, there are different roles for different team riders. We all spend some time in those roles because the team chemistry changes each time we have a new rider come into the fold, and to be honest it takes all of us to fulfill various duties on the team!

What about the previous riders who road with the team, or "alumni as it were"? How does that work if someone decides to come back to the team? Are the requirements (both socially & skill wise) any different for them, as it would be for a new rider? Nope, same expectations! For a returning rider their challenge is to firstly, get into shape again with their riding. They usually already know what they need to accomplish because they have done this stuff before and they might put a little more pressure on themselves because of that fact. Our job is to make sure we let them know, there is NO time LIMIT, and so relieving "unreasonably high" expectations is kind of what we attempt to do.

Another issue for a returning rider is "how do I fit in with this new group"? They may have been in a guiding role previously, and learning to follow the current crew of riders and "team leads" can present a challenge. It may not be the same group as when they left the team.

One could think of the team as a "recipe" with all our different personalities and attitudes. We indeed have to work at it when it comes to "playing" as a team and it's not always easy.




