



#### 17 Honda Fun Facts you can share

In 1922 at the age of 15, Soichiro Honda left school and began working as a mechanic for Tokyo Art Shokai, an automobile servicing company. Six years later, he returned to his hometown, Tenyru, and opened his auto repair businded Tokai Seiki to produce piston rings for Toyota. Unfortunately, his plants were de-

ness. In 1937, Honda founded Tokai Seiki to produce piston rings for Toyota. Unfortunately, his plants were destroyed by bombings during World War II, and he sold the remains of his company to Toyota.

Honda regrouped and founded the Honda Technical Research Institute in 1946 to build and sell motorized bikes. The success of the bikes lead to the formation of the Honda Motor company in 1948 - and the rest is history. Today, Honda is one of the top automobile brands in the world.

- 1. Honda originally manufactured motorized bicycles.
  - During the post-war period, Soichiro Honda and a team of twelve men created engines to attach to bikes. Honda Motor Company became the world's largest motorcycle manufacturer in 1964.
- 2. Many Hondas are produced in the US.
  - Honda is a Japanese company, but not everyone realizes that Honda has several manufacturing facilities in America.
- 3. The Honda Accord was the first foreign vehicle manufactured in the U.S.
  - The 1982 model was produced in Honda's Marysville, Ohio plant.
- 4. Honda makes more than cars and motorcycles.
  - Honda is involved in the manufacturing of other products like watercraft, ATV's, Aircraft, mountain bikes, lawn equipment, and solar cells. They even created a humanoid robot called ASIMO.
- **|5.** Honda has its own airport.
  - It's located in Japan near its main plant.
- 6. Honda is a major exporter of soybeans.
  - They began shipping soybeans from the U.S. to Japan in 1986 because the crop was plentiful in Ohio, Japan had a market for it, and they wanted to invest in the state they were operating in.
- 7. Honda dominates the Indy 500
  - Honda-built engines have won more Indy 500 races than any other manufacturer.
- 8. Honda makes a private jet aircraft.
  - The HA-420 Hondajet is powered by Honda engines.
- 9. Honda is the largest engine manufacturer in the world.
  - The company makes over 14 million engines a year.
- 110. The Honda Gold Wing motorcycle has been in production for over 40 years.
  - The first Gold Wing motorcycle was manufactured in 1974.
- 11. The Honda Civic was Honda's answer to the 1973 oil crisis.
  - The first Civic got 40mpg on the highway.
- 112. Honda made the first four-wheel drive car.
  - It was the 1987 Honda Prelude.
- 13. Joe drove his 1997 Honda Accord over one million miles.
  - Joe Cicero of Maine reached one million miles in 2011 on the original engine and transmission. Honda gave him a parade and a new 2012 Accord.
- 14. Early Honda CR-Vs had picnic tables.
  - From 1997 to 2006, every Honda CR-V had a folding plastic picnic table under the cargo area.
- 15. The Honda Acura is the first Japanese automotive luxury brand.
  - The first Acura was released in America in 1986
- 16. The first car mass-marketed by Honda was the S600
  - It was available as a convertible and fastback coupe.

# GWRRA BC Drill Team Riding March 2017

Drill Team Riding,

With a view to adding something to your chapter newsletters, we are continuing this year with Drill Team Tech articles. While we share these opinions and viewpoints, these articles are not intended to provide you instruction on how to ride your motorcycle. Please seek assistance from a professional riding school, or GWRRA rider course to improve your riding skills. **Head Turns and Steering Input. Which one first?** 

Ok, you see the riders **turn** at the **same time!** (Well hopefully at the same time) J How do we accomplish that? You would think that should be easy, yes? Not as easy as it looks!

You have to determine what you're doing first. Move Handle bars first? Or head turn first...OR.... "Both Head and Bars" at same time?

What happens when you turn your head and "initiate" bike lean at the same time?

Chances are good, your inner ear is not going to like what you did, and you may find it upsetting to your sense of balance.

The drill team rider's correct procession of movements to accomplish turns in "Unison" are as



follows: "Head turn" then "Handle bar movement" then "Bike leans" and we turn.

The head turn helps every single one of us "Look" before moving anything and allows us to see each other, and/or spot our "line" so we hopefully don't overshoot a turn. It's also easier on the inner ear if we turn our head "First" before making the bike lean. The other impressive thing you see is "Everyone" turning their heads simultaneously which makes it look like it's on purpose! Ya I guess it "IS" on purpose after all. J It looks professional as a bonus.

But many movements within a performance absolutely rely on "Timing" and correct timing from each one of us. SOOO, "Synchronizing" head turns will help improve the rest of our "timing" and improve the performance. Say, "Turning your head" sounds like something you would find in an ARC class isn't it? This "turning our heads" thing isn't unique to the drill team because it's really part of a solid basis of riding techniques that are taught across all platforms and riding disciplines without exception. Another advanced rider class in Washington State, (North West Motorcycle School which is actually based on Motor Officers training) teaches the procedure: "Look" "Lock" and "Lean! Meaning; turn head, then bars then lean bike.





# **GWRRA BC Drill Team Riding March 2017**

So we don't "initiate" a turn trying to lean the bike using "body posture" because it's effect is somewhat "Inefficient" and "Imprecise" as a method of steering input at slower speeds. Want the bike to "Transition" quicker with improved accuracy while making slow speed maneuvers? Turn the handle bars with more "authority" while neutralizing upper body and you will observe how powerful steering input can be using the handle bars at very slow speeds.




**Lean angle** can be thought of as a **"product"** of steering input, and power delivery! Using varying combinations of steering input AND power delivery changes lean angle dynamically.

Ok, so we make a "boo boo" and one line turns the wrong way! What now? We are going to add lib it now!! Next decision is how the caller is going to "re-orientate"

the "runaway line" and get the team back to whatever formation or position they need to be in. Eyes in the back of callers head he must have. So long as the lead rider of each line keeps riding and essentially waits for next command, then everything may just look like it was planned that way! Ha ha ha...We only hope!! J

If "a single" rider goes the wrong way, then it's going to be up to that rider to find his position in line/formation again. When you're new at this and you make an error with a turn, we usually just ask the rider to go to a safe spot outside of performing area and wait to see where and when to move in and rejoin the team. (Sometimes we get you to "Tap Horn" if you get



out of formation)

Once a rider gains some experience riding in formations, they will eventually learn how to rejoin the team in a fairly quick and safe manner without a whole lot of wasted time, or movement. But we start slow and give you time and space to adjust with each new experience.


We now have a new Bergman 650 in our garage impatiently waiting for spring.


Certainly being part of the Gold Wing fraternity expanded our social lives. We have made friends all over North America and Australia.




