With the holiday season now under way, here are a few upcoming chapter events to be aware of:

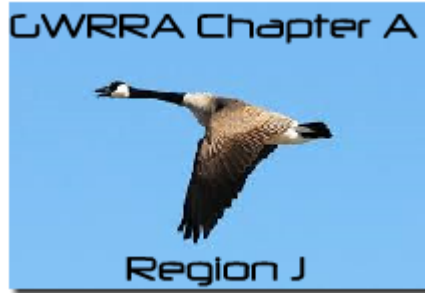

We had a taste of it when we travelled to and from the Region J Rally in Fort Langley back on August long weekend as the smoke was intense. As a follow up, we had about 60 members attend the rally and it turned out to be a success as everyone enjoyed the last Region J Rally. A special thanks to all the volunteers that help throughout the weekend. Chapter BC-C was the Chapter of the Year, Chapter AB-B received the Newsletter of the Year, Individuals of the Year went out to David Ward from BC-A, Roger Matas from AB-A and Scott Kucharyshen from SK-D.

We had a great three week trip to and from Wing Ding in Grapevine with around 8000km travel throughout 14 states. The attendance at Wing Ding was down this year with approximately 4200 members attending. Although the Gaylord Texan Resort was a very expensive place to stay, it was a pleasure to stay within an air-conditioned facility that housed most of the event. The city of Grapevine opened their doors and the hospitality made everyone feel welcome. Even hurricane Harvey kept his distance and the only remnants was a shortage of gasoline for a couple days as people panicked and filled up whatever they could from forty five gallon drums to milk jugs. Membership Draw Article submitted by Barry McMillan

Last year I took my bike into RMR for servicing of my rear shock. After getting it done and getting home, the bike was parked for five months due to the bad weather. So when I was able to ride again I noticed that it felt like I had a flat tire every time I hit a bump in the road or when I was going over speed bumps.

I took it back to RMR and they thought at first that I did not have enough air in the tire. Then one of the guys bounced the rear of the bike and said that the shock wasn't working. I had to make an appointment for later the following week to bring the bike in, so they could take the rear shock out and test it.

At the appointment it took two guys to remove the shock. Once they had it removed, they found out that when it was serviced before they think someone forgot to put the proper amount of gas into the shock, as they could not find any leaks. So after it was fixed and re-installed, all at no charge thankfully, I was good to go.

Before leaving RMR I was given a hint on how to keep my front shocks from extra wear and tear. When you clean your windshield of bugs, etc. make sure you clean your front forks as well. You want to do this because the dried on bugs will be rubbing up against your seals and could cause undue wear.

It all started in the late 50's a friend of mine had a Triumph 500 that he was selling. I bought it and he was going to teach me how to ride it as I had never been on a motorcycle before and bearing in mind I had no drivers license at the time. We went to River Road in Vancouver to learn how to ride the motorcycle and it didn't go so well. I kept stalling it and Hank said give it more gas and let the clutch out and after a few more stalls I gave it lots of gas and dropped the clutch. Hank either fell or jumped off and the bike went into the river and I fell off (I also lost one shoe). Had to call a tow truck to get the bike out of the river and take it to Fred Deeley's to get a new front wheel put on. When the bike was repaired and I went to pick it up I was to embarrassed to tell them that I did not know how to ride the bike so I waited for the store to close and staff to leave before I pushed the bike home. I figured at this point it was time to get my drivers license.

After it was fixed Bill and I went for a ride and we ended up at a railway crossing and back then the ruts for the railway were quite large and I knew I would have to take it at an angle but did not judge it well enough and the bike fell over and Bill landed on top of me and my face was quite a mess. We rode the bike home and then took a taxi to hospital and the cops asked me what had happened and I told them I fell off my bike in hopes that they would assume it was a pedal bike and not a motorcycle as I did not have a license. After the Triumph 500 I bought a new 650 BSA Rocket from Deeley's on Broadway (Deeley's sold Harleys and BSA and later first Gold Wing 1975). Then I had a Harley Davidson until I bought my first Gold Wing in 1980 and then after a few more Wings and then back to Harley.

My buddy Bob Davies, myself and some friends met at Fresgo's in Surrey to start the Vancouver Chapter of GWRRA. It didn't go over to well at first. Dale Crumb took over and he was a pretty good talker and motivator. Chapter started for some time very small meetings. I won the first 50/50 and the prize was \$10. I was the first Ride Captain. For my first ride with the group we went to Point Roberts in Boundary Bay and at that time they used to have two crossings and of course I went to the wrong one and it was closed permanently (what a Ride Captain I turned out to be). So from there we went to North Vancouver.

I've purchased a set of Dunlop Elite 4's on two occasions from Pete's and paid \$395 delivered the first time and \$420 the second, both delivered to my door at these prices total. I have to admit the first price came with a \$40 Mastercard as a promotion from Dunlop. Recently while getting my rear tire repaired at Modern Motorcycle, Aaron one of the owners asked me where I bought my E4's from and I told him Pete's Superbikes. He then informed me he could sell me E4's at a better price than Pete's Superbikes and to prove it he asked my tire size for the wing. After a few minutes he came back with a price of \$365 for E4's and Bridgestones would be even less. So if anyone in BC-A, BC-D or even BC-C needs a new set of tires I would highly recommend giving Modern Motorcycle a call at 604 876-0182 or stopping by their shop at 2816 Commerical Drive in Vancouver. Their prices on tires and a lot of other motorcycle gear are very good, so check them out.

Many thanks to our chapters for advertising our team articles so we might let you all know about "who" we are and "how" to find us.

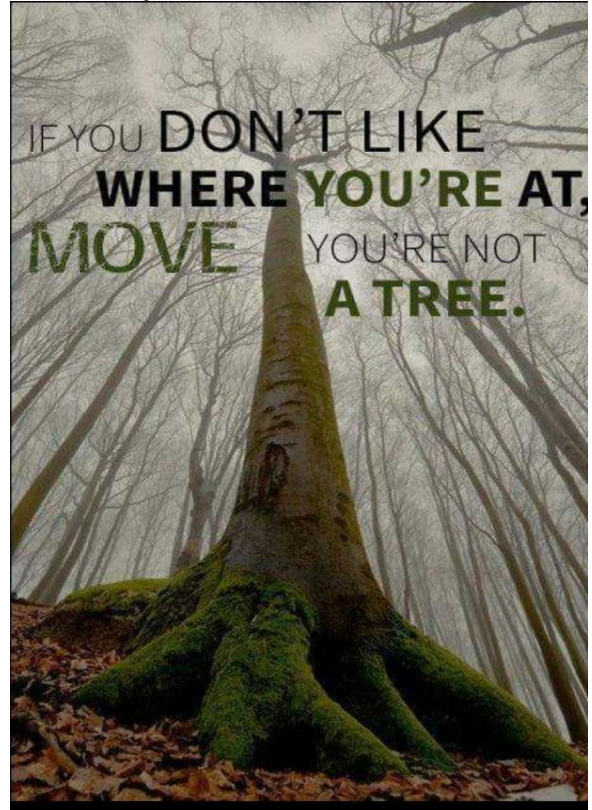

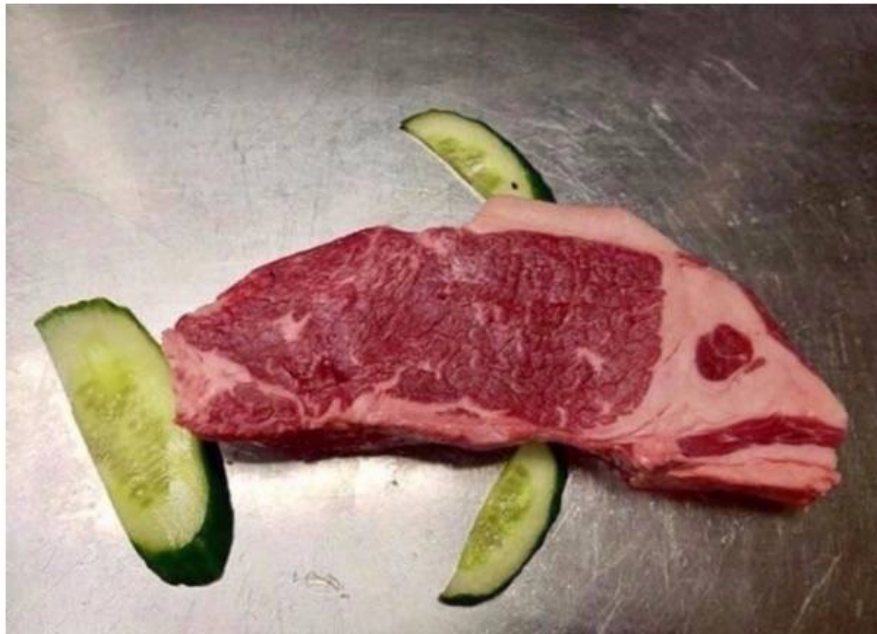

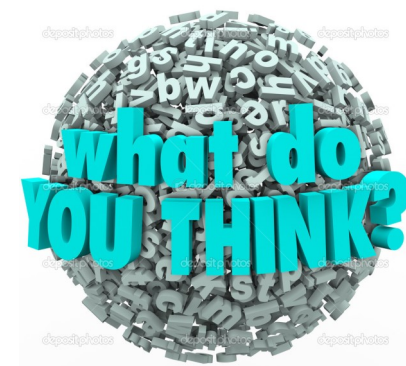
